Sara-Elizabeth, now seizure-free, had her first seizure when she was 16 months old. Throughout her young life, Sara experienced both tonic-clonic and partial complex uncontrollable seizures. Six years ago, Sara-Elizabeth, now 16-years-old, and a New Paltz High School student, turned her focus outward and organized this annual event as a way to create awareness of the disorder.

"My first five walks raised over \$60,000.00, which went towards programming right here in the Hudson Valley" she said. "I hope this year's walk will be even more successful in helping others with seizure disorders and will help demystify the ever present stigma that some people have regarding people with Epilepsy."

Epilepsy is a neurological disorder that affects one in fifty children and one in one hundred adults. Sara's Walk is a valuable resource that helps provide information and assistance to thousands of people with epilepsy.
